Sermon Notes for Sunday, October 2, 2022

Reading:Luke 17:5-10Reading:Lamentations 3:19-26Sermon:New Every Morning

Despair, Affliction, Hopelessness & Deep Bitterness brings us into the Lamentations Text. For the first 20 verses the strong man has been living in Deep Bitterness. All that I hoped from the Lord is gone. My glory is gone. Where does the Strong Man find hope?

"But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope" The writer remembers the good, the bad, the ugly. And still has hope. Hope in the God whose mercies are never ending & steadfast love that never ceases.

There is not much we forget from past experiences. Mostly we recall the most difficult moments more than the joyous ones. We tend to remember failures more than our accomplishments.

What recall speaks of faith & trust & hope in the God who seeks out a relationship with us. God longs to be our companion on the journey of life. Day in Day out!

God has called us beloved at baptism. God calls us to community with God & others.
